TO EDWARD VISCOUNT GORNEURI Captain Generals and Governour in chief in and over the Province of New Jersey New York and all the territories and tracts of land depending thereon in America and Vice Admirall of the same &c:

The Humble petition of divers of the proprietors and purchasers of the western division of New Jersey in all humility sheweth.

THAT WHEREAS we are fully Informed that the Councill of Proprietors for the western division have received a Prohibition from the Lord Cornbury in Councill held at Ambey the fourteenth day of November Anno Dom: 1706 for granting any warrants for laying out lands to by reason whereaf no warrants can be obtained for that end, to the great prejudice of such as have (as they Concieve) a good and lawfull right to take up their Just proportions of land In the division aforessid haveing as good an undevided right as any else can pretend to and have also bought the same of the Indians for a very valuable consideration whereasones we humbly pray that such prohibition and Impediments may be removed and we evidencing our rights to such person or persons as the Proprietors have appointed to Inspect the same may be admitted thereto and we shall as in duty bound forever pray.
