Super county G, on this thirtieth day of November in the Term of November in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty personally appeared in open court before the Judges of the Superior court of common pleas in and for the county of Super aforesaid in the State of New Jersey (the said court being a court of Record having seal and Impression having a Jurisdiction unlimited in point of amount in civil causes and keeping a Record of the proceedings) William Crosby of the Township of Mansfield in the county of Super in the said State who being first duly sworn according to law doth upon his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provisions made by the acts of Congress of the 18<sup>th</sup> March 1818 and the 1<sup>st</sup> May 1820 that he served in the revolutionary War as follows, he enlisted under -der Captain Phillips of the sixteenth Regiment of the Virginia line commanded by Colonel Grayson for the term of three years and continued in that service to the end of the said Term, this enlistment was in the year 1777 and in the year 1780 this declarant re-enlisted under Captain in a Regiment commanded by Colonel Green of the Virginia line for the Term of one year and six months and continued in the service to the end of this last term and during that time was transferred to the staff department to drive a Wagon; That this declarant was wounded in the Battle of Brandywine and was also in the Battle of Monmouth, And this declarant doth solemnly swear that he was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March A D 1818 and that he has not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of his property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it, as to bring himself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary War passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that he has not nor has any person in trust for him any property or securities contracts or debts due to



him nor has he any income other than which is contained in the  
Schedule herewith annexed and by him subscribed, and this declarant  
says that he is about sixty seven years old by occupation a school-  
master, but can not now procure a support thereby that this declarant  
has no family resident with him
