1. A DANISH KNIGHT, the progenitor, was among those who succeeded in obtaining a footing in Normandy, and became allied through marriage with some of the foremost families of noble lineage in Europe. He was the father of:

2. HERFASTUS, son of the progenitor.
3. A DAUGHTER, who m. Walter de Saint Martin.
4. WILLIAM DE WARREN, Earl of Warren, in Normandy, m. a dau. of Ralph de Torta.
5. WILLIAM (2) DE WARREN, son of William (1) de Warren, m. Gundred, dau. of William the Conqueror, and became the first Earl of Warren and Surrey, in England. (See William the Conqueror II.)
6. WILLIAM (3) DE WARREN, son of William (2) de Warren and Gundred, dau. of the Conqueror, succeeded his father in his title and lands, and became the second Earl of Warren and Surrey. He m. Isabel (sometimes recorded as Elizabeth), dau. of the fifth Earl of Vermandois, in France. (See Vermandois II and Pedigree B VIII.)
7. REGINALD WARREN, son of William (3) de Warren and Isabel, his wife, m. Adelia, dau. of Roger de Mowbray. (See Mowbray VII.)
8. WILLIAM (4) WARREN, only son and heir of Reginald and Adelia (de Mowbray) Warren, m. Isabel, daughter of William Heydon, Knight. (See Heydon IX.)
9. SIR JOHN WARREN, only son and heir of William (4) and Isabel (Heydon) Warren, m. Alice, dau. of Roger Townsend, Esquire.
10. JOHN (2) WARREN, son and heir of Sir John and Alice (Townsend) Warren, m. Joan, dau. of Sir Hugh de Port, Knight. (See Port V.)
11. SIR EDWARD WARREN, son of John (2) and Joan (de Port) Warren, m. Maud, dau. of Richard de Skeyton.
12. SIR EDWARD (2) WARREN, son of Sir Edward (1) and Maud (de Skeyton) Warren, m. Cicely, dau. of Nicholas de Eaton, Knight. (See Eaton III.)
13. SIR JOHN (3) WARREN, only son of Sir Edward (2) and Cicely (de Eaton) Warren, m. Agnes, dau. of Sir Richard de Wynnington, Knight. (See Wynnington II.)
14. SIR LAWRENCE WARREN, only son and heir of Sir John (3) and Agnes (de Wynnington) Warren, m. Margery, dau. of Hugh Bulkeley, of Ware, in Shropshire, the ancestor of the Bulkeleys of New England. (See Bulkeley IX.)
15. JOHN (4) WARREN, eldest son of Sir Lawrence and Margery (Bulkeley) Warren, m. Isabel, dau. of Sir John Stanley, Knight. (See Stanley 14.)
Mary-Elizabeth L. Rixford and Oscar Theodore Rixford, grandchildren of the Author, 34th generation from (1) A Danish Knight, founder of the Warren line.
16. SIR LAWRENCE WARREN, of Poynton, son of John (4) and Isabel (Stanley) Warren, m. Isabel, dau. of Robert Legh, Knight.
17. WILLIAM (5) WARREN, seated at Cauntun, in Nottinghamshire, m. Anne, surname unknown; he d. in May, 1496.
18. JOHN (5) WARREN, m. Elizabeth ———; and d. in 1525.
19. JOHN (6) WARREN, of Headborough, was of the parish of Ashbutton, in Devonshire.
20. CHRISTOPHER WARREN, of Headborough.
21. WILLIAM (6) WARREN, of Headborough, m. (1) Anne, dau. of Thomas Mable, of Calstocke, in Cornwall; she m. (2) William Cutting, of Woodland, in Devonshire.
22. CHRISTOPHER WARREN, of Headborough, only son and heir of William (6) Warren, m. Alice, dau. of Thomas Webb, of Sidham, in Devonshire, and among their children was *Richard*, who was a prosperous merchant of Greenwich, County Kent, England, and in 1620 sailed with the historic *Mayflower* Company which founded Plymouth, Mass.
23. RICHARD WARREN, of Greenwich, England, who came to New England in the *Mayflower*, in 1620, and participated in the fight with the Indians at the field of the first encounter. He m. Elizabeth Maych, in England, and had
24. SARAH WARREN, who m. John Cooke (son of Francis Cooke), Mar. 28, 1634, and had *SARAH #2 chart D8*
