
Edward Owen Hall...
BERKSHIREVILLE—Reverend Green Hall, 61, of 104 Forestina St., Toronto, died Tuesday at St. Paul's Hospital at Forest Hill. The family residence of Rev. Hall was at 104 Forestina St., Toronto, where he had resided since 1931. He was born in Springfield, Ill., July 17, 1884, and was educated in local schools, and at Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass. He was ordained in 1908. He was one of the first men employed for construction work on the Canadian Pacific Railways in British Columbia. In 1911 he became a foreman in a sawmill, and in 1913 he became a foreman in a sawmill owned by the British Columbia Lumber Co. Ltd. He was ill with a chronic disease which affected his entire life. He was confined to his bed for several years, and was employed as a janitor at the U.S.A.C. Company's dormitories at the former Hotel Biltmore in Springfield. He was also a member of the old town committee of Scotch Stake. He married Pearl Ayres in Springfield, Mass., in 1911. They have two sons, Fred and Donald.
