Dear Phyllis,

I'm serry that the Stoddards couldn't find me. They must not have looked very hard. The effice where I work, the SETAF Liaison Office, is in the Embassy Annex, just acress the street from the main Embassy. My name isn't listed with the embassy but the receptionist in the Annex knows me quite well. To find me, all one has to do is come into the Annex and ask for me. Most of the time I can get an afternoon off and I would be happy to help your friends see the city. It all depends, however, on how much work there is.

Today is really summer here in Rome. It is humid too - feels like it does in Utah just before a thunder storm. It would be so nice to go to the beach and lie around instead of being here in this hot building working. Maybe later in the summer there will be less work and we can take a few afternoon off. It takes about 30 minutes to go to the sea and there are some nice beach clubs. The water near Rome, however, is dirty and I don't think that it would be much fun to swim.

Toward the last of May, Memorial Day to be exact, we didn't have to work and because it was Monday we had a three day weekend. There is a girl in the next office that I have been going with and so she invited me to go with her to a little town just south of Naples to spend the weekend where she has a house. Tom Fucile, the other fellow in the office, the girl (her name is Kyra), her son and daughter (she is a widow), a friend of the son and the family dog all rode in Tom's car. It took about five hours to get to the little town, Piano di Sorren and it was quite a trip. The dog is very nervous and for the first hour or so when he rides in a car he wheezes and moans. But it was worth the trouble, we spent two and a half days there lying on the beach and taking it easy. I hope that I can spend part of my vacation there.

Kyra is a very nice and interesting girl. I wish that she weren't so much elder than I. Her father was a Persian diplomat who married a Russian. Kyra was born in Russia but has spent most of her life in Italy - her father came here in about 1927 to organize a world agricultural organization (it is now part of the U.N.) and stayed. She has both Iranian and Italian citizenship and speakes Russian, Italian, English and French. Her husband died about four years ago and her father just two or three years before that so she and her mother live together with Kyra's children. Quite often they invite me to dinner, etc. Last Thursday was an Italian holiday and we went to the summer home of one of the family friends (the vice-director of the Bank of Rome). About a month ago I want to dinner there and the Iranian Ambassador to the Vatican came toe. He is an old friend of Kyra's father. All in all it is a lot of fun. Her mother is very nice and we all laugh and play when we are together.

I've been trying to decide where to go on leave. I want to at least see most of Italy and go to Spain before Fall. If one doesn't try to act like a rich American tourist, it doesn't cost too much to travel here so I hope that I will get to see most of Europe before going home.

I can see that it is a mistake to start typing one of these letters. It usually doesn't take much space to say what I have to say and typing it takes even less space.

When you have some, please send me some photos of yourself and of Samoa. I've been telling everyone what a wonderfulk place Samoa is but I don't have anything to back it up. One of these days I'll send you some picture of Rome.
