6. ISAAC³ HALL (*Isaac², Francis¹*), b. Fairfield, 8 Nov 1667,⁸⁷ d. Redding, CT, 7 Jul 1741,⁸⁸ m. Fairfield, 24 Jan 1688/1689,⁸⁹ **JANE HALL BURGIS/BURGESS⁹⁰**, possible dau. of Richard and Ann Burgess, b. ca. 1688, d. aft. 1 Aug 1741, who was baptized at Stratfield with her child Isaac, Jr., on 11 Aug 1695. Five years after this baptism Jane was admitted to the church on 7 Apr 1700, and, just three weeks later on 28 Apr, her husband Isaac with his siblings Francis, John, Mary, and Abigail, "children of Isaac, Sr." (but now ranging in age from Isaac at 33 to Abigail at 17) were baptized.⁹¹ Isaac joined the church in Redding in 1733.⁹² It was reported that he was a physician and practiced in a partnership with his father. Children, recorded Fairfield, baptized Stratfield except youngest.⁹³

Isaac Hall, Jr. (Redding Ridge), Samuel Hall (Redding Ridge), Moses Knapp (Redding Ridge) and John Read (Lonetown) are the settlers known to have settled in Redding prior to 1720. The farms of Isaac and Samuel were contiguous. Redding Ridge, called Chestnut Ridge by the settlers, was desira-

ble to these early settlers because it ran along a path stretching from Danbury to Fairfield. It appears his brothers Francis and John Hall remained in Stratford and sold their portion of the land to Moses Knapp, who was their cousin. In 1709 an Indian Deed was given to Isaac Hall, Jr., Francis Hall and John Hall by seven Indians: Mohaki, Coocongo, Tom, Harry, Old Multeg, Siachim, Young Multeg. (This apparently is the same land granted to father Isaac for his services in the Indian wars.) The deed of 150 acres cost the Hall's 50 shillings. The land was north of Cross Highway and Church Hill to the Bethel line (Hopewell Woods/Sunset Hill).

The Halls of Redding were apparently of the Anglican faith. Most of these early Redding Anglicans chose to reside on Redding Ridge. It is thought that they hoped to establish an Anglican settlement in these vacant lands north of Fairfield's long lots and south of Danbury's boundary (Bethel). However, Redding would not remain solely an Anglican settlement for long as a Congregational Parish was soon formed.⁹⁵

In Isaac Hall's will, dated 17 Apr 1736 and proved 1 Aug 1741, he names son Asa and his wife executors, she to have use of all lands for her natural life. He leaves his home lot and "all my doctor Books, Chirgeons implements and Carpenter tools" to son Asa. He also makes bequests to daughters Jean Guire, Lidea Jud, Anne Corns and to sons Burges and Joshua and grandson David Hall.
