The will of Ruth Allison, of Bordentown, presumably his widow, dated June 26, 1795, she being weak at the time, was proved March 6, 1802. She mentions only one child, Ann Allison, to whom she gives all her household goods, etc. Executor —friend Wm. Snowden. Witnesses—Wm. D. Nixon, Deborah Snowden, James Butler.<sup>357</sup>

A Samuel Hall and Isaac Hall were two of the 64 original grantees of Wells, VT although they apparently never lived there. In addition to the two brothers several other Halls were among the founders. These include Capt. Eliakim Hall and his son, Samuel, Jr. and Isaac Jr., Dr. Celeb Hall, Hezakiah Hall, and Stephen Hall. It is not known which Samuel and Isaac were the grantees nor have any of the other Halls been identified at this time. Matthew Hall and two unidentified Halls, James and Zalmon, were among the early settlers of Wells. 360

Timothy Lyon was a private in Capt. James Smedley's militia company. He is credited with seventeen days service, from Fairfield, in 1757. During the Revolution, Timothy's brother, Joseph, became a Loyalist, joining the British troops at Redding Ridge when they were on their way to raid Danbury. Daniel, their father, was first punished when the town voted on 5 Feb 1781 not to rebate taxes since he has a Loyalist son. Later, the town was not as forgiving. The last entry in Redding town records regarding the war was on August 11, 1783, nine months after the Provisional Articles of Peace had been signed in Paris. "Voted that select men of this town be desired to move out of town: all those persons that have been over and joined the enemy and have returned to town." One of the 28 names listed as Tories was Daniel Lyon. Grumman notes that 28 Redding residents joined the enemy for sanctuary during the war, and eight joining British regiments. The estates of at least nine were confiscated as Tory property; five returned to prevent confiscation. The states of at least nine were

Account books surviving from 18th Century Kent (Conn.) are rare, and that left by Asa Hall 1739-1803 is so complete as to show fairly well the life of the time.

"His own personality is shadowy and we can only infer the sort of man that he was: industrious and by necessity, frugal; trusted, surely, to be allowed to buy the communion wine, to do important errands for his neighbors, and to settle estates, that of his father in Danbury in 1783 (along with his brother-in-law, Timothy Lyon) and that of his wife's brother, Moses Swift. He is literate but his spelling is erratic, "apale" for "apple" being one of his worst attempts. He tends strictly to business and only once is he frivolous enough to note the weather --- "Ap. 3,1803, was a bad snow storm."
