Teacher in H. L. M. S. A. Sept. 1920-1923

Second Councilor in Relief Society June 1921

Dec. 1923 - Released from all offices and called on mission to Indians.

Taught school while among Indians. Fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh grades.

Made many friends and after 20 years still remembered and receive gifts at Christmas time. Loved the Indians and found them true Latter Day

Saints. Have always been a student of the Book of Mormon and so felt that I knew them and their destiny.

Left Wolf Point for Portland Oregon in November of 1924 - The Indians put on mourning when we left.

Spent seven months in Portland Oreg.

Made many contacts because of my Indian experiences. Attended conference at Seattle Washington and gave a talk about the Indians.

Released from mission in May of 1925.

Returned to Springville.

Stake Bee Hive leader ^{May} 1925 - to 22, Nov. 1925, then appointed Glaner leader - May 1934

Taught First Intermediate class in Sunday School 1925 released and given Theological class.

Member of Genealogical Committee and teacher of class Dec. 1925

Held Book of Mormon classes for neighbors ~~Nov. 10~~ 1925 - commenced with six grew to seventeen in January. All read B. of Mormon.

Second vice - president of Daughters of Pioneers. 1925 - 1927

Released from Sunday School.

Had serious operation 21 Feb. 1929.

Saints of ward held special prayer for me at fast meeting. Vomiting stopped after 36 hrs. Six months before I was able to do any thing. Seymour L. Mendenhall Jr Bishop. Came over fast meeting and gave me a blessing. Pres. Roy Maycock told me I would get well and not to become discouraged. The deceiver was trying to take my life, but I would get well. I am well and very thankful. I have given my life in service to show my appreciation.

Maud Hall Curtis my nurse and did much for me with her faith & prayers.

~~The~~ fall of 1929 Pres. Maycock called me to teach Junior Seminary - first in our Stake. "What it means to be a mormon" the subject taught. Only taught a few weeks and became ill.

Nov. 6, 1925 - While bringing an egg from the coop, he said "he bounced it and the egg wouldn't stay in shell."

While riding in his wagon, he ran into a bucket of water and the water stirred out.

4 years old. Buried a dead bird Cliff gave him. When the flowers were withered (about four hours) he dug it up to see if it had gone to heaven.

Enrolled in Primary Aug. 1927.

Enrolled in Sunday School July 7, 1929.

Oct. 1929 had four double teeth filled. March of 1929 had double tooth pulled.

Whooping cough in 1931.

Attended 6 weeks of kindergarten at Lincoln School Miss Mary Rylance, and Bea Summison Straw teachers.

Brought his baskets home with much pride.

Started school Sept. 14, 1931 at Grant. Lucy Rylance. Teacher thrilled with school. Jump, first word learned.

Had chicken pox in 1932 as bad as most of people have. small pox. we were remodeling our

house and I made a bed on the kitchen table so G.S. could be close and warm. At night Solon would carry him unto his bed.

July 25, 1932. in the parade. G.S. drove the buggy in which Uncle Sid rode, representing Great grandfather Wood, who was first mayor of Springville and owned first buggy.

G.S. was seventh and drove like a veteran. It was on this day the Pioneer movement was unveiled.

August 7, 1932, first tithing. Rode the horse for Cliff to unload hay.

G.S. was very dependable from the first year of his life. When work was to be done he was always there. If his friends came to play, he did his work first and never had to be told over once.

Miss Neilson teacher, in third grade. She said he was a splendid worker. On February 13, 1933 had school program to commemorate Lincoln's birthday.

G.S. took the part of Lincoln in drama. Dressed in old overalls and black hat. Did his part fine very proud of him.
