

A copy of a letter written by Nephi Edwin Hall to his cousin George Washington Hall

Springville City Feb. the 2, 1872

Dear Cousin George W. Hall it with pleasure that I take my pen in hand to write you a few lines to let you know how we are a getting along we are all well an d hope that these few lines will find you all the same. I am a going to school now and I am injoying my self first rate the young men here in Springville started a young men micial improvement socity and they have a quite a intrestesing discorse evry week debates and exebitions they will put in one dollar for to belong to it fore one year and that dollar gses to get books to put in the libary and the libary belong to them that puts in the dollar. well it is fine weather har now ther hant benn hardly eney snow on the ground this winter but it has frose the ice so we have had some very good scating. James and Katy Wiggens goes evry once and a wile and scates. we go to a grate many dances this winter Well George i would like to see you once more and if you dont come out her as quick as I as able I will come to see you I dont know wether I wrote to last or not but that dont make eney difference I have been out to East Canyon the most of the summer and the most of last winter I belive the last letter I had from you was last winter. I got my foot out but I gess Lucian wrote to you and told you a bout it Joseph is going to school and the tow girls but James hant Father Hant doing mutch at present Mother puts most of her time in tending to the sick. William and his family are all well Uncil Jesse and family are all well. I hant heard from eney of you for a quite a wile write and tell me how you are a getting a long and how you and the girls are a making it. My self and girls are all right as for you and your girls I cant say
