This compilation of Pedigrees is called the "Ancestors of the Magna Charta Barons and Royalty". It is a continuation from the "Hall" book(my ancestors) and the "Davenport" book(my wife's ancestors).

Many of the royalty and nobility had illegitimate children and the ancestry of their mothers is very uncertain. The Correctness of the charts varies greatly. The older the chart in time, the more likely that tradition is part of the record. Be sure to read the criticisms of old pedigrees from the American Genealogist following this page.

A number before a name indicates which marriage it is of that individual. F G stamped by a name indicates there is a family group sheet compiled.
