and not the son of Anthony Slocum.

Slocum, Giles (p 181, 1st col) was undoubtedly the Giles Slocum bapt. at Old Cleve, co. Somerset, 28 Sept 1623, son of Philip & Charity (Bickham) Slocombe, who were married there on 20 Nov. 1631. Giles was first mentioned at Portsmouth 4 Sept. 1648. He had lands in Taunton which he sold to Nicholas White, & he was undoubtedly a near relative of Anthony Slocum, of Taunton, who removed abt 1610 to Albemarle County, N. C. where he was a member of the Palatine Court in 1679 & died in 1689 testate. Anthony was the ancestor of the Southern Slocums. Joan, wife of Giles, was excommunicated by the Baptist Church of Newport 16:8:1673 & Giles on 23:8:1673. They joined the Quakers. In 1667 he was granted land at Navesink, N. J. by Robert Carr, & on 3 Apr. 1670 he bought two shares of land at Shrewsbury, N. J.
